Nancy received a Doctor of Ministry degree in Preaching from Chicago Theological School focusing on "Setting a Spacious Table: A Model for Preaching an Expansive Theology." Nancy and her spouse, Dawn,


Shawn Redden - Morningside Leader



A few reminders regarding Parking

For the safety of everyone please remember the following:



- In the Cabin areas: Vehicles should only be parked beside cabins when loading and unloading and then
 move your vehicle right away. Getting groceries or doing laundry? Consider using the Berwick Camp
 taxi, instead of bringing your vehicle onto the grounds.
- In Campground area: As outlined in the camp registration, only tent sites (soft sided accommodations) are permitted to have a vehicle parked on the camp site. If you are not staying in a tent, then the same guidelines apply as with the cabins. Unpack/pack then move your vehicle right away! Those in violation will be asked to move their vehicles and repeat offenders may see their vehicle being towed away!
